ENROLLMENT RESTRICTIONS

Enrollment in the comprehensive high schools may be denied to any person who has attained the age of 19 who is not currently enrolled in the school district and has not satisfactorily completed the requirements for graduation (grades 9-12)

. Any student denied admission to a comprehensive high school under the provisions of this policy shall be admitted to services in an alternative setting or alternative educational program offered by the district to allow the individual an opportunity to satisfactorily complete the course requirements necessary for graduation.

The following exceptions to this policy may be made with approval of the principal:

- A. If a student's enrollment has been interrupted by extended illness or physical incapacity, which prevented his or her completion of required units for graduation within the specified time limit by either regular attendance or homebound instruction;
- B. If the student has made expected progress toward graduation in a comprehensive high school the previous school year (i.e., earned a sufficient number of credits to progress to the next grade level:
- C. If a person has passed his or her 21st birthday, has been out of school for at least two years and desires to complete high school by regular attendance, he or she may be accepted for enrollment as a special student, providing said student stays in continuous enrollment until graduation units are met and the work is completed within a ten-semester accumulated time limit.

Any student who qualifies for services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, has not attained the age of 21 by the start of the school year, has not met the requirements for graduation, and is placed in a program at one of the comprehensive high schools shall be allowed to continue attendance in the comprehensive high school program.
